# Japan-ASEAN Online program towards SDGs Understanding depopulation issues and rural development from cases of rural area in Okayama prefecture in Japan.

#### **Overview:**

Depopulation in the region has started not only in Japan but also in ASEAN countries. In this programme, based on the case of Yakage-city, Okayama Prefecture, and other examples, the participants will consider the challenges and countermeasures faced by the region. Moreover, by sharing examples from ASEAN countries through group work, the participants figure out the challenges and specific rmeasures faced by depopulation areas in ASEAN countries.

## **Objectives:**

- 1. To share and deepen our understanding of the depopulation issues faced by Japan and ASEAN countries.
- 2. To develop specific action plans to solve the challenges in the rural areas
- 3. To deepen understanding of other countries through group work with participants from Japan and ASEAN countries.

### **Expected outcomes:**

- 1. Participants will be able to understand the issues of depopulation that Japan and ASEAN countries face.
- 2. Participants will figure out what needs to be done to address the issue of depopulation in Japan and the ASEAN countries.
- 3. Participants will enhance their cross-cultural competency through interaction with participants from Japan and ASEAN countries.
