How to get there:

Queen Sirikit National Convention Center is conveniently accessible by BTS Skytrain, MRT Subway, taxi and car. Suvarnabhumi International Airport is a 45-minute drive from QSNCC.

MRT – The metro is the most convenient mode of transport to QSNCC. Get off at Queen Sirikit National Convention Center station (Exit 3). A tunnel connects the QSNCC MRT Station to QSNCC, and a passageway directly connects to the exhibition hall.

BTS - Take the BTS Skytrain to Asok interchange station, where you catch the subway to MRT Queen Sirikit National Convention Center station. Follow exit no. 3 to the center.

Taxi – Call a public taxi or use application “Grab” Taxi.

Enter at Gate 1 and turn right to drop off area.
