

# Notification: Winter Short-Term Program in Kyoto Center for the Promotion of Global Education (R-Globe) Ryukoku University

The Ryukoku University Center for the Promotion of Global Education (R-Globe) hereby welcomes international students to apply for the newly-launched Winter Short-Term Program, R-STEP (Ryukoku Short-Term Experience Program) on our Fukakusa Campus in beautiful Kyoto City. The program provides specially designed courses in Japanese language, history, and culture and includes lectures in [Japanese Language], [Society and Culture in Japan], and [Buddhism in Japan]. We give students the opportunity to explore past and present Japan through excursions to locations throughout the Kansai area which have been known to evoke images of the country. Eligibility requirements and application procedures are as follows:

#### 1. Location

Lectures: <u>Fukakusa Campus (Kyoto), Ryukoku University</u> Field Trips: Mainly Kyoto, with some excursions to Osaka

Applicants must currently be registered at one of Ryukoku University's Partner Institutions

## 4. Program Fee

## 200,000 JPY

- \*Accommodation and expenses related to Field Trips/Cultural Experiences within the Program are included in the program cost. It will be necessary for the program participant to cover the fees of round-trip airfare (one's own country/region ⇔ Japan) and domestic transportation expenses in Japan (Airport ⇔Univ/Accommodation) separately.
- \*After applying and being selected to participate, bank account information for payment will be sent to participants. Please pay by overseas remittance.
- \*If at least 10 participants are not gathered, the program will be either cancelled or postponed.
- \*In the case too many applications are received (20 participants), the number of participants may be determined by lottery.

Payment should be made after receiving notification of acceptance into the program. Applicants will receive the email of acceptance, with accompanying payment information, between 16 October ~ 23 October. Please note that the program payment is non-refundable.

\* It is possible for flight arrangements to be made through the University's designated travel agency. Please inform us if this is your preference.

## 5 December - 15 December 2023

- \* Participants must make their own arrangements to arrive at the Ryukoku University-designated accommodation between 10:00 AM and 5:00 PM on December 4<sup>th</sup> (Monday).
- \* Accommodations for this program are secured from December 4<sup>th</sup> (Monday Arrival Date) to December 16<sup>th</sup> (Saturday • Departure Date). Please make your own arrangements for accommodations outside of this period.
