Leading Effective Integration of GenAI in Higher Education 2024 Southeast Asia Regional High Level Policy Dialogue

Meeting Background

Generative Artificial Intelligence (GenAI), the spearhead AI technology capable of producing sophisticated content from text, images and videos to simulations and audiovisuals, has become a transformative force across multiple sectors, significantly higher education. GenAI holds transformative potential in personalizing learning, fostering creativity, and enhancing critical thinking while stressing the importance of ethical, inclusive, and equitable implementation. Before its large-scale implementation, we must determine the right path for cautious and responsible integration of GenAI in education, particularly given Southeast Asia's (SEA) distinct challenges and diversity, and establish corresponding regulations.

The International Centre for Higher Education Innovation under the auspices of UNESCO (UNESCO-ICHEI), has been committed to expanding quality and equitable education opportunities through collaborations with flagship universities in various countries to strengthen their capacity in digital teaching and learning, as a way of promoting digital transformation in higher education institutions. In the 2023 International Institute of Online Education (IIOE) Global Partners Summit(https://icheievent.net/), UNESCO-ICHEI released "White Paper on Higher Education in the Era of Artificial Intelligence"

(https://en.ichei.org/dist/index.html#/publicationDetail?nid=27&pid=8&cid=89). The summit was to discuss and share insights, practices and recommendations regarding integration of AI in higher education to IIOE global partners. Following the summit and white paper, addressing the regional challenges of higher education GenAI policies, UNESCO-ICHEI is going to co-organise a series of regional high level policy dialogues to further facilitate integration of GenAI in higher education, together with IIOE National Centres and regional partners. The high level policy dialogue in Southeast Asia region will be the first one, followed by regional high level policy dialogues in Central Asia and other Russian-speaking countries, Arab States and Africa.

Themed "Leading effective integration of GenAI in higher education", the dialogue will gather around crucial stakeholders in higher education areas in Southeast Asia region, including senior officials from the ministries in charge of higher education in Southeast Asia countries, representatives from embassies and National Commissions for UNESCO, presidents, vice chancellors and representatives from HEIs, representatives of enterprises and international organisations. The policy dialogue aims to generate a regional policy recommendation for GenAl integration in higher education, particularly in areas of institutional level master plan, teachers and leadership professional development, and to share and present cases of GenAl application in higher education scenarios, including enterprise applications. This policy recommendation will bring together the wisdom and recommendations of various stakeholders, providing forwardlooking and actionable guidance to facilitate the orderly development of artificial intelligence in higher education. Through constructive dialogue and extensive collaboration, stakeholders from various sectors will convene to garner support and guidance from policymakers. They will consolidate on-the-ground practices, integrate expert knowledge as input for policymakers, and establish a mechanism for policylevel communication.

Meeting Objectives/Outcomes

- Establish a regional policy dialogue mechanism among higher education stakeholders in Southeast Asia countries.
- Address issues of responsible and effective use of GenAl in higher education, and provide policy recommendation and promising cases for higher education policymakers, management and teaching personnels in accordance with the contexts in Southeast Asia countries.
- Release a localized regional policy recommendation on integration of GenAl in higher education.
- A collaborative action plan by stakeholders and partner HEIs for leadership and teacher professional development.
- Release enterprise solutions for HEIs in Southeast Asia countries.
