The 9th APRU Multi-Hazards Summer School

Tohoku University, Japan, Jul 30-Aug 2, 2024

The Ninth Multi-Hazards Summer School (July 30–August 2, 2024) is hosted and organized by the International Research Institute of Disaster Science (IRIDeS), Tohoku University. IRIDeS provides secretariat services as the regional program hub harnessing the collective capabilities of APRU universities for cutting-edge research on disaster risk reduction (DRR) and recovery, shares strategies to cope with campus disaster risk management, and contributes to international policy-making processes on DRR.

The major objectives of the 2024 Multi-Hazards Summer School are to:

- Understand the mechanism of the international DRR strategies
- Learn from the experiences and recovery process from the 2011 Great East Japan Earthquake and Tsunami
- Learn from various disaster science research conducted in different countries
- Discuss the major challenges and roles of academia in progressing DRR in each country

Program

The Multi-Hazards Summer School consists of a 3-day seminar and a site visit to the affected area impacted by the Great Eastern Japan Earthquake and Tsunami.

Topics include:

- International Framework for DRR
- Lessons learnt from the Great East Japan Earthquake and Tsunami
- Experience and case studies by various stakeholders
- DRR research and initiatives by the APRU member universities

Travel Costs

No registration fee is required for this summer school. *Participants will have to fund their own travel and accommodation. No funding support is available from the event organizer.*
